Lesson Focus/Goal/Objective: To illustrate the importance of the relationship to the well-being of both the moose and the wolves.

Activity/Procedure:

The worksheet is small. But it makes a good product. This can be done on any size paper once the process is clear. See how to make an agamograph on You tube:

If you are using the worksheet – draw and color (filling in the entire space) a wolf in image area “A” and a moose in image area “B”. While you are drawing and coloring in A and B, ignore the vertical lines.

Save the top part of the worksheet- cut image A and B into strips using the lines as a guide. Keep the drawings separate and in order. Glue each strip and its corresponding space on the top of the worksheet. Trim around the edges of the piece cutting off the strip labeling (ex. A1, B1, A2, B2)

Accordion fold the whole top portion.

Hold piece on an angle to see each image

Mount on a tagboard by a line of white glue on the back peaks and set aside to dry.

With High School students I have used B&W photos printed out and added color with colored pencil. The You tube video above shows how they can make the project more complex.


Assessment: are 2 images visible from opposite angles? Is there a relationship between the 2 images that shows an understanding of concept, process and product?

Agamograph worksheet

Scissors

Gluesticks or liquid white glue for mounting to tagboard.
Colored pencils
